









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
Registrar Overview

- What is a Registrar?

- Contracted with ICANN to manage domains on behalf of customers
- May choose to offer (or not offer) any gTLD
- Enforces Consensus Policies and accountable to ICANN Compliance

Registrars can operate differently from one another

- Retail servers customers directly
- Wholesale serves resellers (retailers), who have their own customers
- Corporate focuses on corporate/enterprise customers, including brand protection
- Aftermarket geared towards domain marketplace


DNS Abuse - What Comes Next?


- DNS Abuse amendments effective 5 April 2024
 - Meaningful baseline obligations for registrars and registries to take reasonable and appropriate action to disrupt and/or mitigate DNS Abuse and that allow ICANN Compliance to enforce these obligations
 - Focused on DNS Abuse: malware, botnets, phishing, pharming, and spam (when spam serves as a delivery mechanism for the other forms of DNS Abuse)
 - Allow registrars to require webforms for abuse reports, to ensure reports include actionable evidence (contrast with current "anything goes" email reports)
 - Pig Question: how will the amendments impact overall DNS Abuse?

DNS Abuse - What Comes Next?

- Data needed for next steps
 - ICANN Domain Metrica (fka DAAR)
 - ICANN Contractual Compliance
 - DNSAI Compass
 - CPH would like your feedback!

- Supportive of GNSO policy efforts
 - Focused/narrowly targeted
 - Reconcile speed with need for Issues Report
 - Focus on abusive activity rather than red herrings or content issues
 - Bad guys are listening





Registration Data Request Service (RDRS)



Registration Data Request Service

- RDRS pilot will run for 2 years maximum
 - Gathering registration data disclosure request volumes
 - Help inform the Board's decision about building an SSAD
- Two monthly reports published (<u>Jan</u>, <u>Feb</u>)
 - 75 registrars, 2332 requestors
 - 510 requests submitted, 8 marked as 'expedited'
 - 17% approved, 74% denied
- Standing Committee's <u>task</u> is to review the monthly data, consider improvements & lessons learned
- Areas for improvement:
 - Registrars are asking for: 'pending input' status; easy export; view all requests with date & IANA ID, ability to adjust request category; complete request info.
 - Requestors are asking for: Ability to request ccTLDs; ability to request Privacy/Proxy data reveal; ability to get data confidentially (without notifying the domain owner)
