- Current PSWG Work Plan dates back to 2016
- Updated work plan based on 4 strategic goals:
 - 1) Develop DNS Abuse and Cybercrime Mitigation Capabilities
 - 2) RDS/Whois: Ensure continued accessibility, improved accuracy, consistent with applicable privacy law
 - 3) Build effective and resilient PSWG operations
 - 4) Develop participation in PSWG work and seek stakeholder input
- Next Steps
 - a. GAC Members to review and seek clarifications as needed
 - b. Proposed for endorsement in ICANN61 San Juan Communiqué

- Face to face meeting hosted by the European Commission
- 60+ participants including cybercrime experts from 25 Member States and 3 associated States
- Agenda
 - Focus on LEA Access to Whois Data in a GDPR Compliant Whois
 - DNS Abuse Mitigation
 - PSWG Work Plan and Outreach
- Outcomes
 - Access to Whois Data for LEA: specific needs identified (searchability features, data retention for changes of domain registration information, confidentiality of access, etc.).
 - PSWG Work Plan: proposal to improve PSWG outreach to law enforcement practitioners (call for contributions, webinars, LEA IG mailing list, PSWG Newsletter)

ICANN57 > ICANN59: Follow up on DNS Questions to ICANN, led to the identification of key initiatives for GAC involvement:

- Abuse Study and Recommendations of CCT Review
 - GAC Public Comments (22 Sept 2017, 16 January 2018)
 - Will require follow-up on recommendations and further studies

- Domain Abuse Reporting (including DAAR)
 - ICANN60 Cross Community Session on Abuse Reporting
 - Possible GAC Principles on DNS Abuse Reporting
 - Engagement planned on DAAR at ICANN61

- ICANN Consumer Safeguards Initiatives
 - Exploring opportunity to fill policy gaps such as collection of reseller information

- Background
 - GNSO PDP concluded in January 2016
 - PSWG identified public policy concerns
 - GAC Advice (Helsinki Communiqué): concerns to be addressed in implementation
 - October 2016: Implementation Review Team launched
- Open Issues
 - LEA Disclosure Framework: 24-hour emergency response time
 - De-accreditation for providers harboring actors engaged in deceptive, or fraudulent conduct or repeatedly not responding to LEA requests
- Next Steps
 - March/April 2018 (est.): Public Comment Period
 - May 2018: additional work per Public Comment/GDPR
 - August 2018 (est.): announcement of program
 - November 2019 (est.): compliance enforcement begin
